In the Rear View Mirror

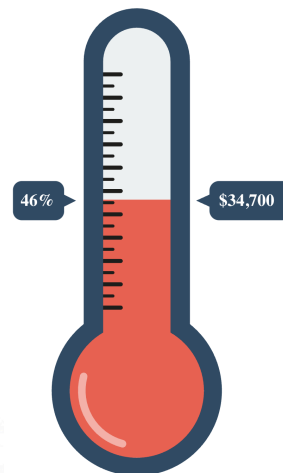
